Research fellow and lecturer of European Union Law at the University of Tuscia in Viterbo, Daniela is member of the executive board of the Academy of Law and Migration (ADiM), part of the editorial board of ADiM Blog, managing editor of the journal *European Papers* and member of the SIDI Blog editorial committee. Since 2018 she has been member of the coordinating committee of the Interest Group on Migration and Refugee Law of the European Society of International Law (ESIL). From 2017 to 2019, Daniela was postdoctoral researcher in EU Law and lecturer of European Cultural Heritage Legislation at the University of Florence, where she has been involved in two European projects: the e-NACT (e-Learning National Active Charter Training) Project and in the RoSaE (Rome and Sarajevo for Europe) Project.

In 2017 she was visiting fellow at the University of Bern, within the framework of a research project financed by the National Center of Competence in Research. From 2015 to 2017, she was postdoctoral research fellow in EU Law at “Roma Tre” University. From 2012 to 2017, Daniela was teaching assistant of EU Law and EU Migration Law at LUISS “Guido Carli”. From 2010 to 2016, she collaborated with the Chairs of International Law and EU Law of the University of Perugia (Law Dept.).

Daniela Vitiello studied International law and EU law in Rome (LUISS, Sapienza), Durham (2008) and The Hague (2012), before obtaining her Doctorate from Sapienza University of Rome (2014). She wrote extensively on EU immigration and asylum law and policy, including the external dimension of EU policies on human mobility.
