The [Jean Monnet Centre of Excellence on the Integration of Migrants in Europe \(IntoME\)](#) is a study and research platform for the analysis of migration processes, with a special focus on integration matters.

In its first ten months of activity, IntoME has established valuable relations with other networks of academics and high-level experts having a strong competence in immigration and integration studies. First, it has contributed to strengthening the dialogue – already established by the Tuscia University through the [Academy of Law and Migration \(ADiM\)](#) – with the [Institut de recherche sur le Maghreb contemporain \(IRMC\)](#), Tunisia) and with the Migration Subnetwork of the [Mediterranean Universities Union \(UNIMED\)](#).

In addition, from June 28th to July 9th 2021, the Centre hosted the first edition of the [Summer Training School on Legal and Political Challenges of Migrants' Integration in Europe](#): an experimental two-week course, gathering participants from all continents and scholars and experts from all over Europe. The Summer Training School will be held every year on a different topic related to the Centre's field of analysis and research.

Due to the success of this first edition, the School will be integrated into the curriculum of the newly-established [Master's degree on Security and Human Rights](#) (European Studies), which will run from the a.y. 2021-2022 at Tuscia University, will be entirely taught in English, and will focus also on human mobility and integration studies.

This synergy between the Centre of Excellence and the new Master's degree will further expand the reach of IntoME activities and projects.

Refugees' integration is a complex process of mutual exchange and adaptation. Full participation in host communities' social and economic life is a necessary pre-requisite for a successful integration path, leading to satisfactory work experiences and fairer job search, while unleashing the human potential of cohesive and inclusive societies. Successful Education Strategies for Refugee Students** was held online on June 25th 2021 to shed light on the crucial contribution that Italian Universities can provide to a successful refugees' integration process, inviting the University staff, civil society, interested NGOs and UNHCR representatives to share their views and best practices to boost the inclusiveness and receptiveness of host communities.

IntoME SUMMER TRAINING SCHOOL on Legal and Political Challenges of Migrants' Integration in Europe

The first edition of the **IntoME Summer Training School** offered an invaluable opportunity to foster a shared understanding on **Legal and Political Challenges of Migrants' Integration in Europe**, exploring the topic from different angles, including the legal, political, social, economic, geographical and historical perspective.

Highly distinguished scholars and experts in the field committed to discuss key topics revolving around **three aspects**: i) pre-entry and early integration measures; ii) mid-term integration, including non-discrimination legislation and practices; iii) and long-lasting integration, including urban design for inclusion.

At the end of each week, a **Training Session** offered the forty participants enrolled at the School the opportunity to reflect on up-to-date issues and become the true protagonists. Assisted by the School's trainers, they elaborated inspiring and thought-provoking position and policy papers on key selected topics of the course.

ADiM Doctoral and Postdoctoral Colloquium – International Migration and Labour Market Integration

Due to its focus on “International Migration and Labour Market Integration”, the third Doctoral & PostDoctoral Colloquium of the Academy of Law and Migrations will be organized in cooperation with the Jean Monnet Centre of Excellence on the Integration of Migrants in Europe (IntoME) and will take place on 23 and 24 September 2021 in Lampedusa, Italy. Like the previous editions, the aim of the Colloquium is to enhance the scientific contribution of young researchers in the migration field (Ph.D. students, postdoctoral researchers and research fellows), promoting discussion across disciplines, between the researchers and with senior scholars. The third edition will be entirely devoted to the relationship between international mobility, labour market entry and integration of migrants. In particular, it will focus on the dynamics of inclusion and integration, also in light of prominent contemporary issues such as the Covid-19 crisis, the labour exploitation in the agrifood system, the free movement of EU citizens, and the different treatment of highly skilled, low-skilled and seasonal workers.

Glocalism – Cities and Migration in the New Post-Pandemic Normal

Public space is the background of our daily life and the framework of our professional research. The pandemic has precipitated the progressive disappearance of communities from the collective spaces of the city and contemporary society, which, in turn, is continuously changing in terms of both form and needs. This situation prompted us to open a scientific debate on the relationship between migration and urbanization in the new post-pandemic normal. A question regarding these emerging scenarios is whether and how urban areas and small municipalities are changing due to the impact of migrants’ settlement. How can we rethink public spaces in the digital era? How can we avoid forms of marginalization and the ghettoization of migrants?

In order to answer these questions, a special issue with a distinctive multidisciplinary approach will be hosted by “Glocalism”, an international peer-reviewed, open access and cross-disciplinary journal that aims at stimulating increasing awareness and knowledge around the new dynamics that characterise the “glocal” reality.
