



The [Jean Monnet Centre of Excellence on the Integration of Migrants in Europe \(IntoME\)](#) has been established in September 2020 at the Department of Modern Languages and Literatures, History, Philosophy and Law Studies (DISTU) of Tuscia University (Viterbo, Italy). It aims to be an **education and research platform on migration and asylum processes**, with a special focus on integration matters. IntoME promotes excellence in its research and teaching activities, by **connecting networks of academics and high-level experts** with strong competence on immigration, asylum, integration, inclusion, and participation studies. The Centre of Excellence is committed to **establish synergies with other Jean Monnet modules and centres** working on issues of common interest (*inter alia*) by inviting their staff members to take part in IntoME activities and actively engaging in other JM projects. Furthermore, the Centre of Excellence is connected to the **Academy of Law and Migration (ADiM)**, created in 2018 as a result of the Project of Excellence (2018-2022) awarded to the DISTU Dept. by the Italian Ministry of Education and Research (MIUR) for the quality of its scientific publications in the public law area. With its 448 members, among Italian and European scholars, and 20 institutional partners, from Europe and North Africa, **ADiM is a consolidated forum supporting IntoME activities**, especially in the search of new avenues of collaboration with academic institutions in Europe and beyond.

## Main Recent Events

### ***IntoME SUMMER TRAINING SCHOOL on “Unleashing the potential of legal migration through a whole-of-society approach”***

The second edition of the Summer Training School, entitled: “Unleashing the potential of legal migration through a whole-of-society approach”, is one of the forefront activities of the Jean Monnet Centre of Excellence on the Integration of Migrants in Europe (IntoME). The STS was delivered in hybrid mode from 27th June to 1st July at DISTU Dept. of Tuscia University, in Viterbo (Italy), welcoming 44 attendees, among international students and PhD candidates, selected on a competitive basis. Among the participants, students enrolled in the Master’s Degree in *Security and Human Rights* at Tuscia University and students from other European (Belgium, Denmark, Spain) and non-European Universities (Armenia, Brazil, Gambia, Georgia, India, Iran, Nigeria, Tunisia, Ukraine, Uzbekistan, Yemen).

The School follows a seminar-based teaching method, with seminars delivered by leading scholars from prestigious partner Universities, both in Europe and Italy, coupled with interactive training sessions, which allowed the participants to experiment advanced brainstorming and negotiation techniques and inclusive decision-making interaction methods, based on the principles of co-creation.

Among the lecturers at the School: **Sophie Robin-Olivier** (Université Paris 1 Panthéon-Sorbonne), **Maurizio Ambrosini** (University of Milan), **Stefan Schlegel** (University of Bern), **Zvezda Vankova** (University of Lund), **Giulio Di Blasi** (European Commission), **Jean-Pierre Gauci** (British Institute of International and Comparative Law), **Daniele Albanese** (Caritas Italia), **Marco Borraccetti** (University of Bologna), **Meltem Ineli Ciger** (Süleyman Demirel Üniversitesi) and **Jean-Pierre Cassarino** (College of Europe).

The issues addressed concerned the potentialities and obstacles to legal migration from a largely interdisciplinary perspective, highlighting the contribution of the University of Tuscia to the field. *“In this sense, the School contributes to the construction of a complex of skills and knowledge at the service of the University’s overall ability to promote development and social inclusion processes”* – declared Mario Savino and Daniela Vitiello, the School coordinators.

## ***ADiM Doctoral and Postdoctoral Colloquium on “Addressing forced migration in the Schengen area: The Ukrainian crisis as a turning point?”***

The fourth Doctoral and Postdoctoral Colloquium on “Addressing forced migration in the Schengen area: the Ukrainian crisis as a turning point?” was a very thought-provoking meeting, both for the sensitivity of the topic and the quality of selected papers. This edition addressed the relationship between mass migration and human mobility in the Schengen area, with a focus on the dynamics of migrant reception and solidarity, taking into account the impact of the European response to the war in Ukraine on the overall direction of the EU immigration and asylum policies. The four sessions – coordinated by Mario Savino and Alessandro Bufalini respectively – concerned the following aspects: I) Protecting Refugees or Borders?; II) EU Solidarity and its Limits; III) The Ukrainian Refugee and the Others; IV) The Ukrainian war as a turning point for international cooperation? Several scholars attended as discussants: Alessandro Bufalini (University of Tuscia), Francesco Martines (University of Messina), Stefano Montaldo (University of Turin), and Daniela Vitiello (University of Tuscia).
