

ALESSANDRO BUFALINI

Alessandro Bufalini is Associate Professor of International Law at the University of Tuscia, where he is Vice-President of the School of Law and Academic Coordinator of the Master's Program in Security and Human Rights. He is also member of the Doctorate School Committee of the PhD Course in European and Global Markets Law. Crisis, Rights, Regulation. He is member of the Guarantee Act Committee (Comitato Unico di Garanzia) at Tuscia University. Previously, he was Research Fellow in International Law at the same University (2017-2022).

Before joining Tuscia University, he was post-doc researcher at the University of Milano-Bicocca (2014- 2016) where he has been working on the United Nations peacekeeping operations. He holds a degree in law (cum laude) from the University of Bologna and a PhD from the University of Macerata in International and European Union Law.

At Tuscia University, he teaches Public International Law (2014-present), Global Governance of International Security (2021-present), Migration Law (2021-present) and International and European Criminal Justice (2022-present). He has been Lecturer of Migration Law at the University of Macerata (2013/14) and has been invited as visiting professor at the Université Catholique de Lille, teaching a course

on Global Governance (2018/2019 and 2019/2020) and at the V. N. Karazin Kharkiv National University, holding a course of EU Migration Law, within the context of a Jean Monnet Module.

He is currently member of the Editorial Committee of QIL-Questions of International Law, one of the leading international academic journals in the field of public international law. He has been member of the Editorial Committee of the ADIMBlog (2017-2023) and acts as reviewer and referee for a number of academic journals.

Over the last years, he has been Visiting Fellow at the University of Paris 1 Panthéon-Sorbonne, the Amsterdam Center for International Law, the Max Planck Institute for Foreign and International Criminal Law in Freiburg, the Institute for Advanced Legal Studies in London and the Max Planck Institute for Comparative Public Law and International Law in Heidelberg.

He has also been invited at many important international and national conferences, seminars and workshops at several universities and research centres (among others, University of Amsterdam, University di Ferrara, University of Bedfordshire, University di Catania, Max Planck Institute for Comparative Public law and International Law, University of Nice-Sophia Antipolis).

He has published two monographs and more than thirty articles and essays in collected volumes and leading Italian and international peer-reviewed journals. His main research interests include international and EU migration law and policy, citizenship studies, the modes of liability and the principle of legality in international criminal law, the law of state responsibility, the use of force in international law and the relationship between peace and justice in the international legal order.
